- June 11** **Rick Marsi** (naturalist, photographer, columnist, author of Wheel of Seasons) presents a program that describes paddling, rafting, sailing, and motoring down the wildest and most beautiful rivers on earth.
- June 18** **Reprise 60's** brings you the fabulous sound that defined a generation of music. Gary Ingraham, Phil Guidici, Bob Greaves, Mike Samsonic and Kevin Ferris perform songs of the '60s.
- June 25** **The Horseshoe Lounge Playboys** 5-piece band creates powerful vocals backed by guitar, mandolin, fiddle, acoustic bass, and drums: "acoustic backwoods Americana rocking roots" music.
- July 2** **Family Movie Night** (movie TBA).
- July 9** **The Irish Stoutmen** An Irish folk quartette performs a great mix of powerful rebel songs, jovial drinking songs, toe tapping reels and beautiful Irish ballads.
- July 16** **An Evening with Lena Bushnell** Local historian Ginny Mullen shares a video and scrapbooks about Lena Bushnell's 95 years of life in Newark Valley.
- July 23** **An Evening of Railroad History** focusing on the Auburn branch of the Lehigh Valley Railroad and the history of the Newark Valley Depot.
- July 30** **Tom Quigley and Grassanova** Solid traditional bluegrass as well as popular songs done in a bluegrass/newgrass style, along with a bit of swing, blues and early jazz.
- Aug. 6** **Absolutely Reptacular** Rob Felt & Christina Costa present an opportunity to learn about and even *hold* live reptiles!
- Aug. 13** **The Ithaca Dixieland Band** The Dixiekats play a variety of Dixieland music: tunes made famous by Louis Armstrong, Pete Fountain, King Oliver and more.
- Aug. 20** **Alice Detrick** plays and sings classic country, current hits, old favorites, inspirational, and good old country yodeling. There is something to please everyone.
- Aug. 27** **Hot on the Trail of the Ivory-Billed Woodpecker** Cornell's Living Bird magazine editor Tim Gallagher, author of The Grail Bird, tells of the 2005 rediscovery of this rare bird, once believed extinct in the U.S.
- Sept. 3** **Cobblestone Crossing** performs music of the Kingston Trio; Peter, Paul & Mary; John Denver; Woody Guthrie; and a touch of bluegrass and country.
- Sept. 10** **James Eggleston** "UFO's of the Modern Era," from 1940's to now; Roswell to NYS; view stars/ star charts.
- Sept. 17** **The Accords** Gene Perry & Frank Korosec perform a mixture of Polish and Italian music.
